



Love Unbound: Five Films For Freedom 21–22 March 2024, Thessaloniki

23 March 2024, Athens

The <u>Love Unbound: Five Films for Freedom Festival</u> is set to make a comeback this March to mark the tenth anniversary of <u>Five Films for Freedom</u>. For the second year of the festival, we are expanding our reach with activities in both Thessaloniki and Athens. The festival is committed to exploring and delving into a variety of LGBTQIA+ and gender equality experiences by harnessing the transformative influence of arts and culture. The festival is co-organised by the British Council and <u>Parenthesis</u> in collaboration with <u>Technopolis City of Athens</u> and under the auspices of the City of Athens and the City of Thessaloniki.

The festival focuses on our global programme <u>Five Films for Freedom</u>, which includes a collection of short LGBTQIA+ films from around the world. Through film screenings, panel discussions, empowerment workshops and mentoring sessions, the festival aims to open unbiased discussion on current equality gender issues based on 'real life' experiences through artistic outputs. In the parallel programme of the Love Unbound festival, there will be a series of discussions and workshops hosting leading UK professionals from the film and media industries including:

Melanie Hoyes (she/her), Director of Inclusion, Inclusion / CEO Office, British Film Institute: Melanie leverages her postgraduate studies and teaching background in film and TV to lead groundbreaking research on ethnic diversity in UK film. Her role involves advocating for increased access and equity in the industry, implementing strategic interventions and collaborating globally to embed diversity and inclusion into policy and practice. **Anna Smith (she/her), Film Critic and Broadcaster:** Anna Smith is the former President of the UK Critics' Circle, she has written about film for over 20 years, contributing to the *Guardian, Rolling Stone UK, Time Out, Deadline Hollywood, Sight & Sound, Metro* and more. Anna co-founded and hosts the podcast <u>Girls On Film</u>, which was listed as the 'Best Feminist Film Podcast' and is dedicated to championing diversity on screen and regularly discusses LGBTQIA+ issues. Anna appears regularly on BBC TV, Radio 4 and Sky TV.

In **Thessaloniki**, at Ypsilon, we will be hosting an exhibition of [KERKIS], the book by Dimitris Tairis, a poignant and personal photographic narrative of the photographer's personal life, while on the top floor we will be delivering <u>Stronger Together for Gender</u> <u>Equality: the transformative power of female leadership</u>, an interactive workshop which aims to discuss the significance of gender equality in leadership roles, addressing daily challenges and fostering inclusive practices through personal reflection, experience exchange and practical tools. In **Athens**, we invite you to sign up <u>HERE</u> for the Cultivating Creativity – Speed Mentoring Session for Women and Femininities in Creative Industries. <u>Women On Top</u> will be hosting an engaging speed mentoring session tailored for women and femininities whether they're aspiring to work or are already employed in the creative sector. For our young friends, <u>Rainbow Families Greece</u> invite you to join [*Paramythosalata*], a workshop for families and children (aged 4–12), which uses storytelling as a medium to break stereotypes and help them to envision alternative, inclusive social structures in a fun way. The day will close with networking drinks and music.

The festival is curated by <u>Parenthesis</u> together with the <u>British Council</u> and will take place at <u>Ypsilon</u> in Thessaloniki and <u>Technopolis City of Athens</u> in Athens. Participation in the festival is free and open to all.


